Further, if you believe that public knowledge of this written application could reasonably be expected to result in harm to your safety or mental or physical health, you may ask the judge or justice for permission to present your information verbally instead of completing this form, or for restrictions on the release of the information that forms the basis of this application.

- 1. **Indications of mental disorder** (e.g., hallucinations, delusions, depression, extreme excitement, specific difficulties in relating to others)
- Need for psychiatric treatment (The above indications of mental disorder may also indicate a need for a psychiatric treatment. List any other indications of need for treatment, such as previous psychiatric treatment, use of medication for mental disorder and/or recent changes in behaviour.)
- 3. **Need to prevent the person's substantial mental or physical deterioration** (e.g., failure to eat, uncharacteristic verbal abusiveness, sleep problems, extreme withdrawal. Were the early signs of any previous episodes the same or similar?)
- 4. **Need for protection of self or others resulting from the mental disorder** (Are there examples of clearly or potentially harmful behaviour or symptoms? - 5. Refusal to attend voluntarily for examination by physician
